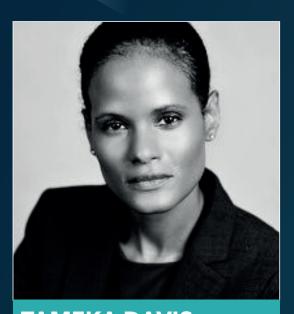




JUSTIN DAVIS

Nienke also speaks Dutch and French and has moderate knowledge of Spanish and German.



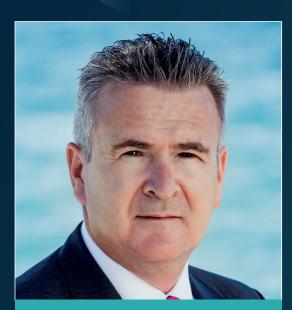


SURBHI PAREEK
