Irene Lynch Fannon teaches Company Law, Corporate Insolvency Law and Contemporary Issues in Corporate Law and has published extensively in these areas including articles in the *Journal of Corporate Law Studies*, the *Northern Irish Legal Quarterly*, the *Dublin University Law Journal*, and *The Commercial Law Practitioner*; book chapters in numerous collections and books including *Corporate Insolvency and Rescue* (1st Edition, Butterworths, 1996), *Corporate Insolvency and Rescue* (2nd Edition, Bloomsbury Professional, 2012), *IRELAND : Partnerships and Corporations* (First Edition, 2010, Second Edition, Kluwer, 2016) and *Working Within Two Kinds of Capitalism* (Hart Publications, 2003). She is currently the recipient of .5 million Euro from the EU Commission (DG Justice) for a project entitled JCOERE-Judicial Co-operation for Economic Recovery in Europe (800807) examining corporate rescue and judicial cooperation in the EU. She has served on a number of Irish government bodies, including the Audit Review Committee (2000) enquiry into offshore into taxation irregularities. She was a member of the Business Regulation Forum established by the Irish Minister for Enterprise and Employment in 2005 and served on The High Level Group on Business Regulation (Better Regulation Forum) until 2014. She is currently a Ministerial appointee to the Company Law Review Group and Chairs the Insolvency Law Sub Committee www.clr.org. (see website on recent reports). and has been appointed to the EU Commission of Experts on Insolvency Law in 2021. She has been the Head of the Department of Law (1999–2002); Dean of the Faculty of Law (2000–2002) and Head of the College of Business and Law (2008-2013) at *University College Cork*.
