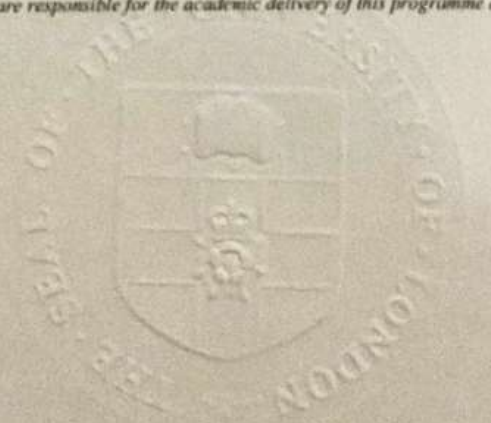

The Examinations Board reserves the right to condone a failure at a mark above 30% in the final year, if it considers there is sufficient compensation in the other subjects.

Prior to the 2003 Examination session, the paper Public Law was known as Constitutional Law. Prior to the 2005 Examination session the paper Common Law Reasoning and Institutions was known as The English Legal System.

The Solicitors Regulation Authority and the Bar Standards Board of both recognise this qualification as a "Qualifying Law Degree" provided the period of study involved is not more than six years and the graduate has passed the assessments in the Foundations of Legal Knowledge in not more than three attempts. The Foundations of Legal Knowledge subjects are Criminal Law, Public Law, Elements of the Law of Contract, Law of Tort, Law of Trusts, Land Law and (for students who registered after September 2001) EU Law.

The University of London Law Schools are responsible for the academic delivery of this programme and for the examining of the award.





