Detail

The Juris Doctor is a postgraduate degree consisting of 144 units of credit. It is taught in English and normally takes three years of full-time study, or the part-time equivalent. The program structure requires the successful completion of compulsory and elective courses. Candidates for admission to the program require a Bachelor degree in a specialisation other than law, or other approved equivalent academic and professional qualifications. This program provides the academic training required to enter the legal profession, including skills and knowledge applicable to a wide variety of other careers. Honours may be awarded based on Weighted Average Mark (WAM) and satisfactory performance in written research.

Program accreditation

The program satisfies academic requirements for admission to legal practice as approved by the NSW Legal Profession Admission Board. Graduates are eligible for admission as legal practitioners in New South Wales, the Australian Capital Territory, the Northern Territory, Queensland and Victoria upon completion of additional practical legal training.
