The Committee's records reflect that you have satisfied all of the requirements for admission to the practice of law in California, and the Committee has recommended your admission to the Supreme Court of California.

The State Bar's oath packet and registration process is now fully automated. Information about the registration process, enrollment, fees, Minimum Continuing Legal Education requirements, and the New Attorney Training Program is posted on the State Bar's <u>Virtual Oath Packet</u> webpage. Please visit the <u>Taking the Attorney Oath</u> webpage for important instructions on taking the oath. Instructions for completing your State Bar registration card electronically will come via email from DocuSign. Please check your email for that important correspondence; this digital card is required to take the attorney's oath.

The Admissions Rules require you to take the attorney's oath within five years after the last day of the administration of the bar examination you passed. Otherwise, you will again have to pass the California Bar Examination and have a current positive moral character determination in order to be recertified as eligible to take the attorney's oath and be admitted to practice law in California.
