The LL.B. degree at Trinity College, Dublin is a four year degree. In each year of the degree, students must study modules amounting to 60 ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer System). The ECTS-rating of each module is indicated in brackets after the module name. The overall result for each of the Junior Freshman, Senior Freshman and Junior Sophister years is an arithmetic average of the marks obtained in each module for that year, weighted according to its ECTS-rating.

Where a student has passed a module at a second or subsequent attempt, this is recorded on the transcript. This might occur where the student had failed that module at the first attempt or failed a number of modules and, as a result, was required to sit all modules from that session.

The Overall Degree Result is based on a student's performance in the Junior and Senior Sophister years combined. No discrete result is assigned to the Senior Sophister year. The primary basis for calculating the Overall Degree Result is the arithmetic average of the grades obtained in each module in the Sophister Years, weighted according to its ECTS-rating. Secondly, the Court of Examiners is entitled to have regard to the pattern of classes obtained by a student over the two parts. In particular, a student who obtains marks in at least one class in modules amounting to at least 75 credits out of the 120 credits required for the final two years of the LLB shall be awarded a degree in that class, provided the marks in all other modules are no lower than one class below the class of the degree to be awarded.
